Local company wins grant to bring Small Scale DAB to South Gloucestershire

Local not for profit company, South Glos Digital Community Interest Company (SGDCIC), has been successful in its recent grant application to Thornbury Town Council. SGDCIC is owned by Thornbury Radio, the local station for Thornbury and the surrounding area.

SGDCIC was successfully awarded the licence by Ofcom to run small-scale DAB covering Thornbury, Yate and Almondsbury areas. The proposed DAB coverage region covers a large part of the South Gloucestershire, along with the crossroads of the M4 and M5 corridors.

The grant for £3000 was presented to Chris Criddle and Glyn Roylance, members of Thornbury Radio by Thornbury Town Mayor, Cllr James Murray (photo attached).

Cllr Murray visited the Thornbury Radio studio on Castle Street recently, meeting presenters from Thornbury Radio and hearing about the local community radio station.

Nigel Lane, Director of SGDCIC said, "Thank you to Thornbury Town Council for this grant. It will be used towards to the set-up of a digital transmitter covering Thornbury and the surrounding area. Our DAB transmissions will benefit listeners across South Gloucestershire by bringing them a wider choice of radio stations including a new way to listen to Thornbury Radio."

Thornbury Radio already covers 45,000 people in and around Thornbury and has 15 volunteers working together at the station. When DAB transmissions run by SGDCIC commence in 2024, the popular local station will be available to listeners on DAB as well as FM, smart speaker and online.

SGDCIC are continuing to raise the money needed to establish transmissions from two sites in South Gloucestershire. One site is near Thornbury and the other in Yate.

SGDCIC have brought in Nick Piggott from Muxnet as technical consultant and technical provider.

SGDCIC are looking for any service, local, regional, or national that might be interested in expressing an interest in broadcasting to this area of South Gloucestershire. The proposed DAB service area covers listeners in and around Thornbury, Yate and Almondsbury.

Small-scale DAB is an innovative technology which provides a low-cost route for local commercial, community and specialist music services to broadcast on terrestrial digital radio to a relatively small geographical area.

Several small-scale DAB multiplexes have been running on a trial basis over the past five years, but Ofcom is now advertising non-trial small-scale radio multiplex licences.

Thornbury Radio is more than a radio station – we are: Your Choice. Your Voice! While the big faceless commercial stations go increasingly regional and national, Thornbury Radio will continue to highlight local news, events and causes in and around Thornbury. We will spotlight local organisations and get to grips with local issues that affect Thornbury.
